Inauguration of Arms License Registration Branch, Visitor's Lodge and Computerised Compounding Branch for Traffic Violations in Jalandhar Commissionerate

Sh. P.S. Gill, DGP, Punjab inaugurated the court of the Commissioner of Police Amritsar and Licensing & Registration Branch in the CPRC building at district Amritsar on 5th May, 2010.

The court of the Commissioner of Police has been made operational to provide speedy justice and restore confidence of police functioning in the general public. It would be the endeavour of the court of the Commissioner of Police to use preventive powers effectively against the anti-social elements, which try to disturb & vitiate general peace of the society and create law and order problems.

Powers under certain sections of the Cr.PC, which were earlier exercised by the District Magistrate, were shifted to the Commissioner of Police in the three cities. The court of Commissioner of Police was established to decide the offences under the said sections. Primarily, the offences pertaining to the preventive measures envisaged in the code to maintain law and order and public peace requiring quick action.

To execute these functions, a separate Licensing and Registration Branch has been established in the CPRC building to help the general public in obtaining various permissions under one roof. This is applicable to all the police stations falling under the jurisdiction of Amritsar Police Commissionerate.

Orders issued by the Government of Punjab on the Recommendations of the Fifth Pay Commission

On the Recommendations of the Fifth Pay Commission, the Government of Punjab has issued the following orders in the favour of government employees:-

- **Cash handling allowance**

The Cash handling allowance has been revised by the state government w.e.f. May1, 2010

S.No	Amount of Cash handed per month	Cash handling allowance per month
A.	Up to One Lac	100
B.	Above One Lac and upto 10 Lac	200
C.	Above 10 Lac and up to 25 lac	300
D.	Above 25 Lac and up to 50 lac	400
E.	Above 50 Lac	500

In this regard the current service conditions/rules shall remain operative as earlier.

- **Enhanced T.A. to the handicapped personnel**

The State Government has enhanced the T.A. of the blind and physically handicapped personnel from Rs. 250/- per month to Rs. 450/- per month w.e.f. May 1, 2010. Other service conditions/rules shall remain applicable as earlier.

- **Family Planning Allowance**

The Punjab Government w.e.f. May 1, 2010 has decided to pay the family planning allowance to the group C and D employees equal to an increment of their revised basic pay or minimum Rs. 210/- and the employees of group C and D who have restrained their families with only two daughters would be paid an amount equal to two increments.

Apart from this the employees belonging to any category who are drawing family planning allowance before May 1, 2010 would continue to draw minimum Rs. 201/- w.e.f. May 1, 2010. The State Government has further clarified that employees who have adopted small family norms between January 1, 2010 to April 30, 2010 would continue to draw an amount equal to their one increment or minimum Rs. 210/- on the basic pay in unrevised scales w.e.f. May 1, 2010. The current service conditions/rules, as applicable now, shall remain in force.

- **Leave encashment**

The State Government has decided to continue the leave encashment for 300 days to the employees of the state since January 1, 2006, but it has further decided to pay leave encashment for 300 days for unutilized leave in the revised pay scales to the employees who have since retired on August 1, 2009 or thereafter, Besides, the decision regarding payment of arrears of leave encashment in revised pay scales to the employees retired between January 1, 2006 to July 31, 2009 shall be taken later on. The service conditions/rules already applicable in this respect shall continue to remain in force.

- **Gratuity**

The State Government has decided to pay gratuity in the revised basic pay to the employees retired on August 1, 2009 or thereafter. The decision regarding payment of arrears of gratuity in the revised pay scales to the employees who have retired from January 1, 2006 to July 31, 2009 shall be taken up later. The service conditions/rules already applicable in this respect shall continue to remain in force.

- **Increase in the medical advance for chronic diseases**

Keeping in view the public welfare, the state government has issued instructions to enhance the departmental powers of the sanctioning authority for sanctioning of the medical advance against the estimated expenditure for the medical treatment to the government employees/pensioners as below:

Department punishment in Disciplinary cases (Misconduct)

As a matter of policy, the guidelines were sent to all the punishing authorities/appellate authorities vide memo No. 4482-80/E-II (2) dated 22.05.2009. Now in supersession of the same, fresh guidelines as below shall be applicable.

(1) Conviction on criminal Charge-Departmental Punishment

In a corruption case where conviction is not stayed by the appellate court during the pendency of appeal against conviction, it is not desirable to retain him in service.

When an enrolled police officer is convicted by trial court on a criminal charge for an offence where the prescribed punishment in the Indian Penal Code, 1860 read with the Criminal procedure, 1973 is more than 3 years, dismissal should be the norm irrespective of the quantum of the sentence awarded by the court.

When an enrolled police officer is convicted by trial court on a criminal charge for an offence where the prescribed maximum punishment is less than 3 years, punishment other than dismissal may be given irrespective of the quantum of the sentence awarded. Such lenient view should be dealt with as per the provisions of Rule 16.2(2) of Punjab Police Rules, 1974 as noted above.

Pendency of an appeal in Appellate Court should be no ground for keeping the departmental action pending against the convicted enrolled police officer. Similarly, in case where the sentence has been suspended by the Appellate Court also should be no ground for keeping departmental action pending against him.

(2) Disciplinary cases (misconduct)-Departmental Punishment

Willful Absence - When an enrolled Police officer willfully absents from duty without proper sanction of leave on five occasions or more and the cumulative absence on these occasions is more than 150 days- Punishment of dismissal from service may be awarded.

When an enrolled police officer willfully absents for 90 days or more continuously even if total instances of his absence are less than five should also attract the same punishment.

In case when cumulative absence is less than 90 days and the enrolled police officer is not habitual absentee- Punishment other than dismissal should be awarded.

Indulging in spying, smuggling and anti-national activities- Punishment of dismissal from service should be awarded.

Causing indiscipline among fellow policemen going on strike or mass casual leave and spreading disaffection against Government, riots, promoting felling of enmity/hatred between different classes of citizens of India- Punishment of dismissal from service should be awarded.

(3) Loss of official weapon (s)

- a) Willful act- Punishment of dismissal from service should be awarded.
- b) Negligent act- Major Punishment other than dismissal from service may be awarded.
- c) Habitual misbehavior with senior officers and willful disobedience of lawful command of seniors- Punishment of dismissal from service should be awarded.
- d) Misconduct on first occasion- Punishment other than dismissal may be awarded.

(4) Escape from custody-under trial/convicted.

- a) Willful act- Punishment of dismissal from service should be awarded.
- b) Negligent act- Punishment other than dismissal from service may be awarded.

(5) Habitual drunken misbehavior in public place while on duty- Punishment of dismissal from service should be awarded.

(6) Misconduct on first occasion- Punishment other than dismissal from service may be awarded. Loss of Govt. property concerning the security of State e.g. wireless sets official Laptops, Hard discs and classified documents/information etc. in any manner.

- a) Willful act- Punishment of dismissal from service should be awarded.
- b) Negligent act- Punishment other than dismissal from service may be awarded.

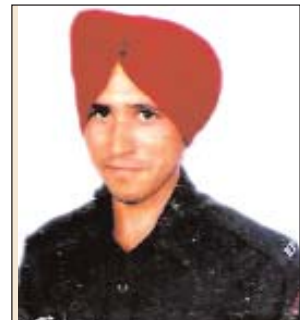

The gunmen and the SP ran after the two. In cross firing Ct. Balwinder Singh, No. 1365, the gunman of the SP, died on the spot and amongst the two men, one got injured at his neck and was arrested. During interrogation, it was found that they were members of an interstate robbers gang and had committed several crimes at different places. A huge amount of jewellery & several fake number plates were recovered from their car.

Rs. 200 Crores grant in aid for augmenting police training

Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, Bureau of Police Research and Development vide its letter No. 54/10/2010-Training VI/BPRD dated 21st May 2010, has sanctioned an amount of Rs. 200 crore to Punjab Police for upgrading the standard of training facilities as recommended by the 13th Finance Commission.

SSP Patiala and SHO, PS City Rajpura honored for excellent performance

Sh. P.S Gill, DGP Pb., awarded DGP Commendation Disks to Sh. R.S. Khatra, PPS, SSP Patiala and SI Bikramjit Brar, SHO, PS City Patiala for providing excellent leadership in detection of crime and busting of gangs on 2 May 2010. The SHO was also presented an award of Rs. 1 lakh for his crime detection and recoveries.

Decentralization of Financial Powers for Sanctioning Medical Reimbursement Bills

The Punjab governments vide its letter No. 21/47/2009-5/1210 dated 24-6-2010 has decentralized the financial powers for sanctioning medical reimbursement bills to employees/ officers/ pensioners of the state government and their dependents. The financial authorities for sanctioning medical reimbursement bills shall be as under:

- a) District officer of the concerned department (for govt. employees and pensioners having offices at district level), District Civil Surgeon (for such pensioners, not having the office of their department at district level) and the heads of the departments of Punjab government at Chandigarh (for employees posted at Chandigarh and pensioners residing at Chandigarh after retirement) may sanction a medical bill up to rupees 50,000 (fifty thousand) in each case. Besides, full financial powers for sanctioning medical bills have been accorded to the heads and administrative secretaries of the departments.
- b) The powers to verify medical bills in case of government hospitals.
 - 1) Up to rupees 25,000/- per case - concerned doctor.
 - 2) Up to rupees 1,00,000/- per case - civil surgeon (with the approval of district medical board)
 - 3) Director, Health and Family Welfare, (with the approval of district medical board or in other cases on the recommendations of medical board at the directorate) have the full powers.
- c) The district Civil Surgeons can verify the bills up to rupees 25,000/- with the approval of district medical board for the treatment in private hospitals of Punjab/ Chandigarh. All the bills above shall be verified by Director, Health and Family Welfare, with the approval of district medical board.
(A separate medical board has been set up at the directorate for the employees of the head quarters).
- d) All medical bills of out of state private hospitals shall be sanctioned by the Director Health and Family Welfare, Punjab with the approval of medical board.

The concerned authority shall be responsible to check the above bills for medical reimbursement as per financial rules/ instructions issued by state government from time to time. It is also clarified that in cases where a relaxation is required under Punjab Services (medical attendance) Rules, 1940 and concerned instructions, the same shall be disposed off in consultation with Health department and Finance department.

Note: These conditions shall apply from the date of issuance of the instructions. The medical bills may be sent to the Director, Health department/concerned departments as per these instructions.

Central Seniority List of Constables

The central seniority lists of the constables have been prepared as per Punjab Police Act 2007. This list has been placed on the Punjab Police Website (www.punjabpoliceindia.org). Besides this the list has been provided to all units in Punjab through CD (Compact Disc). If any one has objection regarding his seniority, he can write to CPO Chandigarh through his controlling officer.

Inauguration of Arms License Registration Branch, Visitors Lounge and Compounding Branch for Traffic Violations in Jalandhar Commissionerate

The Arms Licensing & Registration Branch, Visitors Lounge and Computerized Traffic Offences Compounding Branch of Jalandhar Police Commissionerate were inaugurated on 25th May 2010 by Sh. P.S. Gill, IPS, Director General of Police, Punjab. The DGP also handed over badges to volunteers under the 'Traffic Marshal Scheme'. The purpose of the Traffic Marshal Scheme is to involve citizens in traffic education and assist the traffic police in enforcement duties. The traffic marshals are citizen volunteers who work on traffic issues in close coordination with Traffic Education Cell by visiting schools, colleges, educating road users at traffic lights, organizing seminars and workshops.

The Arms Licensing & Registration Branch of the Jalandhar Commissionerate has been entrusted with the functions of issuance of new arms licenses, renewal of arms licenses, issuance of duplicate licenses, endorsements of weapons on licenses, issue of transport licenses, transmission/inheritance of licenses, issue of NOC/Permission to licensees, change of address of licensees, registration of outside licenses and creation of master database of earlier issued licenses.

The Licensing & Registration Branch personnel have been given a distinctive, citizen - service oriented identity with separate dress code and identity badges. ISO:9001 Certification for the Arms Licensing & Registration Branch has also been applied for and the process is expected to be completed within the next six months.

The Computerized Traffic Offences Compounding Branch of Jalandhar Police Commissionerate has operationalized a new software named 'Challan Bharo' which would help in creating data bank for all traffic offenders, enable searches for subsequent offenders for enhanced fines and offer convenience to the citizens for speedy resolution of traffic challans. The traffic challans would be compounded at the single window of the compounding branch on the same day. Required computer hardware has also been installed.

Important decisions taken by the DGP, Punjab recently

Sh. P.S. Gill, DGP/Punjab has taken some important decisions in the recent past which are as follows:-

- **Rs 20 Lac to the PAP, Hospital granted**

Punjab Armed Police being a very large organization, has a hospital functional in the Campus for the welfare of the force. Sh. P.S. Gill, DGP, Punjab has allotted a fund of Rs 20 lacs to the PAP hospital, which would update the facilities in the hospital since the hospital was established many years ago and the machinery has become very old. The hospital needs to be furnished with modern machinery, instruments and testing laboratories with latest techniques.

- **Rs 2.41 crore to D.A.V. Police Public schools of distt. Ludhiana, Mansa and Sangrur**

Rs. 2.41 crore (1.25 crore for Ludhiana, Rs. 1 crore for Mansa and Rs.16 lacs for Sangrur) sanctioned out of Shaheed K.R.S Gill Police Education Fund to DAV Police Public School Ludhiana, Mansa and Sangrur for the construction of school buildings. With the Construction of School buildings of DAV Police Public School of these districts, the students of these schools would be provided with more facilities.

- **Bar on Local Rank and CII**

Directions have been issued vide order No. 12505-605/E-3 dated 31.5.210 and 13327-426 E-(1) dated 9-6-2010 that no local rank/ CII (exemptee) shall be awarded from 1-6-2010 onwards, and no organization would recommend for the award of local rank/CII (exemptee), but at the time of retirement a case can be forwarded for awarding the local rank as per instructions already issued in this regard.

- **All Branches of DGP office to be air-conditioned**

A Sum of Rs 1.03 crore has been earmarked for the purpose of the air-conditioning of the remaining part of the office building and changing of the roof of the building and the cooling system, so that the functioning of the offices of the Punjab Police Headquarters may be more effective and efficient. This would facilitate a smooth working of the officials during the summer.

- **Increase in the Strength of Punjab Police**

Keeping in view the deficient numerical strength of Punjab Police and increasing population, industrialization, modernization and cyber crimes the crime rate of the state is increasing regularly. Similarly for controlling the increased picketing by racial organizations, for smooth flow of ever increasing traffic and for establishment of law & order effectively, the strength of district Police has been increased.

- **Law & Order and investigation staff separated in the police department**

Punjab Government vide its letter No. 16/41/2005-39 (6) 975 dated 7-4-2007 has made a separate division for law & order and investigation staff at police station level from the HC rank to SI rank, according to which in the new division of the sanctioned posts, law & order and investigation staff has been separated. In this regard detailed order No. 1543-1660/ E-I (2) dated 17-2-2010 has also been issued.

- **Authorities regarding punishment and appeal and ACRs in Commissionerate declared**

On account of the notification of Commissionerates and posting of DIG/Rank officers as Commissioners, it is proposed to outline the channel of rendition of ACRs as well as nominate the appointing authorities/punishing authorities and appellate authorities for dealing with matters pertaining to punishments and appeals, initiation, review and acceptance of Annual Confidential Reports of officials of different ranks posted in the Commissionerates of Amritsar, Ludhiana and Jalandhar.

The following regarding punishing and appellate authorities are approved for taking decisions in departmental enquiries initiated against officials of different ranks:-

State Special Cell, Amritsar nabbed Terrorist Bakshish Singh @ Baba

Punjab Police has got the major breakthrough with the arrest of Bakshish Singh @ Baba s/o Rattan Singh r/o Nizamniwala, distt. Patiala, a dreaded terrorist of Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF) from Amritsar by the team of State Special Operation Cell, Amritsar, Intelligence Wing of Punjab Police. District Police of Patiala and Ludhiana Rural was on his look out due to his involvement in planting of Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) at LPG Bottling Plant at Nabha and at Air Force Station Halwara. He also planned and executed the attack on Baba Gurmit Ram Rahim Singh, Chief of Dera Sacha Sauda near Karnal in February, 2008. Haryana Police kept the reward money of Rs. 1 lac for giving information about his whereabouts. The Punjab Police had also kept the reward of Rs. 5 lac for giving any information about him. Bakshish Singh @ Baba was in possession of RDX weighing 2.3 KGs, 1 detonator, 30 bore pistol with 28 cartridges at the time of his arrest.

Important decisions taken regarding medical Re-imburement to employees

In the public interest and in view of the demands of various organizations, Punjab government vide its letter No. 12/10/10-5/1165 dated 14-6-2010, has taken following important decisions allowing medical re-imburement to the employees / pensioners for more chronic diseases.

1. The improved list of chronic diseases includes the following as per new instructions :

1. Chronic Renal Failure.
2. Cancer/Malignancies of different organs.
3. Heart failure cardiomyopathy (Myocardial Infarction) and Angina pectoris.
4. Thalidemias.
5. Degenerative Disorders of Nervous System and other organs.
6. Organs Transplants.
7. Congenital Disorders.
8. Cirrhosis.
9. Coeliac Disease.
10. Immunological disorders leading to disability including AIDS.
11. Chronic respiratory failure.
12. Chronic pelvic infection.
13. Spinal injuries.
14. Insulin dependent Diabetes Mellitus.
15. Haemophilia.
16. Intractable/Resistant Epilepsy.
17. Chronic Glaucoma.
18. Ulcerative Collitis.
19. Brain Stroke.
20. Obstructive Sleep Apnea Syndrome.
21. Hypertension.
22. Hypothyroidism.
23. Secondary Adrenal Insufficiency.
24. Diabetes Mellitus Type-2.
25. Hepatitis-B.
26. Hepatitis-C.
27. Hyperthyroidism.
28. Rheumatoid Arthritis.
29. Schizophrenia.
30. Epilepsy.
31. Mental Retardation.
32. Respiratory, disease leading to Chronic Respirator failure.
 - (i) Vribcguak Ashma.
 - (ii) Bronchiectasis
 - (iii) Chronic obstructive pulmonary Diseasea
 - (iv) Interstitial Lung Disease etc.

2. The government has accorded recognition to Medical College/Hospital, Sector-32, Chandigarh for issuing the certificates for chronic diseases. The medical certificate charges will also be reimbursable.

3. The expiry period of the certificate of chronic diseases has been enhanced from 3 years to 5 years. The medical certificates already issued to the employees shall be valid for 5 years from the date of issue.

Note -The instructions shall come into force from the date of its issuance and the same have been issued in view of the decision taken in the meeting dated 6.5.2010, held under the Chairmanship of the Hon'ble Chief Secretary, Punjab.

Now House Rent Allowance for 100% the Constabulary

60% of the Constabulary of the Punjab Police was being paid House Rent Allowance for which there was resentment amongst them from quite some time and they had also filed a writ petition regarding this in the Hon'ble High Court. On the writ petition, filed by them, the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court decided in their favour, according to which now 100% constables of Punjab Police will get House Rent Allowance. The Judgment of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court is reproduced below:-

"All the head constables and constables are entitled to be treated at par in the matter of grant of House Rent Allowance except where rational basis exist for different treatment, the effect of the Judgment will be prospective"

A proposal in this regard has been sent to the government for approval. As and when the approval is accorded, the orders will be issued.

Ban on reallocations/transfers due to promotion

The promotions in the police department were pending since long, due to non-issuance of central seniority. The seniority was last issued in the year 2009. Apart from this, the Police Act 2007 has been implemented from 20.2.2008 and accordingly the police department has been divided into four cadres. Under this act the seniority of each rank is determined at the central level. The employees were being promoted at the range level before the Police Act came into force and they were not being sent to any other range. Under the new Act the departmental promotions are being done according to the central seniority. In view of a vacant post in any range the personnel is transferred to that range as per his seniority. This step has been taken in the interest of the employees so that they may get promotions at the earliest.

Under the directions of the Hon'ble DGP, Punjab, recently a large number of promotions have been given recently in every rank and this process is in full swing at present. Since a large number of promotions have been done, many police employees have been reallocated from their parent range to the other ranges. Till the process of promotions is not completed a total ban has been put on transfers/reallocation from one range to the other, so that the process of promotions may be completed at the earliest.

Initiatives taken to make the traffic police more active and effective

Several initiatives are being taken by the traffic police to make it a readily available force for helping the public with an effective traffic management. In this connection several initiatives are being taken in every district to train the officials deputed in the traffic wing in providing first-aid and primary emergency help to the victims of the road accidents. Punjab Police State Apex Committee for community policing and first-aid posts are also taking concrete steps in this direction. Apart from this the Health Department has also responded positively to depute Para-medical staff on the ambulances of the traffic wing. Principal Secretary, Health and Family Welfare has proposed to depute Para-medical staff on 24 ambulances in the initial phase of this sequence. Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court has also issued directions regarding restoration of ambulance service in COCP 143.

First meeting of 'Academic and Training Advisory Council' Concluded at Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur

Punjab Police has constituted a high powered "Academic & Training Advisory Council" to re-orient and re-design its training parameters in order to improve the overall field police working effectiveness. The first meeting of the Advisory Council was conducted at Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur under the chairmanship of Mr. P.S. Gill, DGP, Punjab. All heads of different wings of the Police departments participated. In his address, Mr. Gill announced a series of steps to be initiated at different levels for strengthening police training and other related matters. He also highlighted the importance of developing special skills among police personnel to deal with different roles and duties with a major focus on improved public dealings.

Mr. S.K. Sharma ADGP (HRD & CP)-cum-Director, PPA, Phillaur conducted the proceedings of the meeting. He briefed the officers about the recent changes made in the training methodology and contents for Basic Promotional and Specialized training Programmes. An impressive visual presentation on different aspects and issues related to training was presented by Mr. M.F. Farooqui, Dy. Director (Indoor) PPA, Phillaur.
